That which is less evident and relatively difficult to measure and make an assessment about:

## Key Principles from Realist Evaluation \& Synthesis:

- Addresses the questions: "what works, for whom, under what circumstances and how?" (as opposed to 'does it work'?)
- Theorizes programmes, policies, interventions and services
- Asserts that it is not interventions that create change, rather, people create change (Pawson and Tilley 1997)
- Defines "mechanism" as how people respond to resources.
